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A second review was carried out in PUBMED to establish rarity since the case as such was presented in 2018, and the manuscript was written in the same year. The second search using mesh terms and Boolean operator (Cutaneous histoplasmosis) AND (AIDS-Related Opportunistic Infections) yielded 7 results in the last 5 years, so we proceeded to update the bibliography after reviewing the instructions for authors, highlighting the rarity of cases of cutaneous histoplasmosis among immunosuppressed patients in the context of HIV infection.

The abstract is reworded and corrected according to the reviewers' suggestions.

The case report describes the cutaneous presentation and how the aetiological diagnosis of the lesions and the causative microorganism was determined. The discussion and introduction are updated. The ethical aspects of the case report are added at the end of the clinical case, since the authorization signed by the patient (written informed consent in Spanish) is available, as well as the authorization to collect the information from the clinical history and results by the sub-directorate of teaching and research of the hospital where the care and treatment was carried out.

We proceeded to insert the methods used for the diagnosis of the case in the discussion, as well as clarifying that the Vancouver format is automatically generated by the Zotero application.
