Abstract: our article does not discuss the global pathophysiology of sepsis, we have focused on more molecular damage related to NET formation so we consider that it is not beneficial to discuss the broad pathophysiological mechanisms involved. As suggested, we have briefly described the conclusions we have reached.

Introduction: we have added more epidemiological reports on the impact of sepsis both in incidence and mortality in different countries, including Latin American countries.

We make a brief reference to the phenotypes of sepsis and which is the most important for our review.

Methodology: we have added a paragraph where we include the methodology for the performance of our review.

Ethical aspects: our manuscript is a scientific review, we have not violated any ethical norm, so having authorization from an ethics committee is not very useful for this manuscript.

Results: it has been mentioned to us that we only make descriptions of the results, however, in table 1 we have given a description of the studies analyzed.
